Yanks Take Track Honors

TEL AVIV — American athletes dominated the gold medal column in the Eighth Maccabiah Games that ended Tuesday night, but for the first time they were beaten in the sport they invented, basketball. Israel beat the American hoopsters 74-70 in the final, surviving an American rally that nearly wiped out a 13-point halftime deficit at 39-28. Tal Brody of Trenton, N.J., again led the Americans in scoring with 21 points. Stuart Kerzner of Brooklyn, N.Y., was next with 12. Gabby Teichner topped Israel with 19.

The Americans won a total of 63½ golds, but finished second overall to Israel in total medals, 151½ to 138½. Israel took 48 golds, 52½ silver and 51 bronze medals. America had 40½ silver and 34½ bronze.

The United States won three golds in the track and field competition that featured the final day of the so-called Jewish Olympics.

Milt Bressler, Birmingham, Ala., took the 400-meter men's hurdles in 54.1. Michael Fratkan, Richmond, Va., won the 200-meter in 21.6 and the U.S. easily took the 1,600-meter relay ahead of Britain and Israel.

Other American golds went to Debbie Lipman, Long Beach, Calif., in the platform diving with 124.88 points and Allan Fox, Los Angeles, who won the men's tennis singles by defeating Jackie Saul, South Africa, 6-2, 6-3.

Bernie Lepkofer of New York also won a gold and retained his heavyweight championship in the judo competition by defeating Brazil's Milton Lovato. Jorge Gleser, New London,

MONTGOMERY, Ala. — Plagued by tire troubles half-way through the race, DeWayne "Tiny" Lund made up a lap and a half in the last 50 miles to beat Ken Rush at the finish line Tuesday night and win the Montgomery 200 Grand Touring Race.

Rush built a substantial lead over Lund, from Cross, S.C., when the eventual winner was forced into the pit midway through the 100-mile race. But Lund made up the deficit and passed Rush on the final lap, taking the checkered flag two car lengths in front.
