

Restraining Order Settlement Seen

GREEN BAY (UPI) — Green Bay Packer player representative Ken Bowman, an attorney, is thumbing his Wisconsin statutes instead of a playbook, but he probably won't get to use them.

The corporation counsel for the Green Bay Packers said Friday a settlement is in the works over a restraining order that triggered the arrests of 21 striking players here Thursday night before a Chicago Bears-Green Bay Packers exhibition game.

"Counsel for the Green Bay Packers subsequently were contacted by counsel for the NFL Players Association with reference to the impending injunction proceedings, and, as a result of that fact, arrangements are being made to work out a solution, and we have agreed to dismiss the injunction proceedings," said Fred N. Trowbridge.

The 21 were arrested when they said they would not leave a parking lot outside Lambeau Field after the Packers Corporation obtained a temporary injunction barring picketing in the area.

The Packers released a statement late Friday saying the corporation ordered the injunctions because of Bowman's comments earlier in the week that he would try to keep the game from being played.

Fourteen Packers, five Bears, Washington Redskins Willie Holman, a former Bear, and St. Louis Cardinal Norm Thompson were taken into custody. Police said Friday, however, there were only 20 arrests.

Bowman said the discrepancy came when police failed to book Rich Coady of the Bears, who just walked from the police station.

The players went along peacefully and were released — local players on their own recognition and out-of-towners on \$100 bonds.

"We accordingly obtained the restraining

order to be sure the pickets were picketing where they legally should be, and so that no one, participant or spectator, would be injured," the Packers said in a statement.

Bowman indicated he felt the arrests were a plus in the public relations battle.

"I think this brought my bunch closer together. We got together briefly for pizza and some beer after we were released, and I sensed a real feeling of unity," he said.

"It's one thing to say you're going to back a cause, but it's something altogether different when all of a sudden the police are taking people away and you say, 'Hey, that's my teammate they've got there,'" he said.

It was reported the injunction was requested because about 30 strikers from a motorcycle plant in Milwaukee had joined the player pickets, and were harassing ticket buyers outside the Packer office. The players had been picketing without incident near the practice field since the training camp opened.

Coach Dan Devine did say that he didn't "like to see the abusive type of thing (referring to the Milwaukee pickets) that was up here with people who weren't ours. A few people may overreact to what happened, but I actually don't think so."

Asked if he will take back the veterans when the strike ends — even if it drags on for weeks — Devine said: "I can." As for bad feelings, Devine said, "I can't believe that as a football player... that winning... that once the season starts that anything else could be more important."

"I'm glad he can feel that way," Bowman said when told of Devine's comment. "I know I can."

Meantime, in Washington, the top federal mediator announced the resumption of negotiations between the NFLPA and owners of the 26 NFL clubs.
